### Association honors retired UPS GC

Joseph R. Moderow, the retired senior vice president, general counsel and board member of UPS, is scheduled to receive the 2008 Horatio Alger Award in Washington this week.

Moderow will also be inducted into the Horatio Alger Association of Distinguished Americans, along with nine other business leaders, including Aulania L. Peters, a retired partner from Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher, according to a press release by the association.

"My path seems to have been not only unusually challenged, but also incredibly blessed," said Moderow, according to the release.

Born in Wisconsin in 1948, Moderow recovered from a childhood bout with polio only to grow up under a verbally abusive father who eventually stopped speaking to the son, the release said. Moderow became the first in his family to attend college by attending the tuition-free California State University at Fullerton; he received his law degree from Western State University.

He started working at UPS as a package unloader and sorter and held various management assignments over his 35-year career at the company, completing his career at UPS with primary corporate responsibility for the legal, government affairs and public affairs. He served as general counsel to four UPS chairmen and CEOs and was a member of the UPS Board of Directors from 1988 to 2004.
